## MAGDALEN EXtended Project Qualification (EPQ) for all

Develops a skill-set sought out by universities and employers

Independent Research. Referencing of Sources.

Time Management. Presenting skills.

2 periods per fortnight of in-school guidance



Could be on any topic you want - e.g. Do different weather and pitch conditions have the potential to change the result of a cricket test match? Is Society prejudiced against people with special educational needs?

AS qualification (like a university dissertation for A level students





### Nagdalen Waynflete Scholarship

- Offered only to highest achieving students
- Independent academic research project in collaboration with Magdalen College School, Oxford
- Get support from lecturers / professors at Magdaien
  College Oxford, and the opportunity to discuss your paper with tutors from Oxford University
- Produce a highly academic 5000-word dissertation project
- Can be converted to an EPQ qualification





### **GCSE** Resits

Students can take a GCSE resit in **EITHER** 

**English Language or Mathematics** 

This is new to Magdalen – it reflects the challenges to students of the last few years, that Magdalen's core ethos is that we are community focused and serve the needs of our community, and that not achieving a GCSE grade 4 in both these subjects limits students' options in later life.

This is studied in place of the EPQ.

### Entry criteria

- an average point score of 4 across all GCSEs taken<sup>#</sup>.
- GCSE grade 6 for A levels that have a higher tier GCSE paper (Languages, Maths, Sciences Biology, Chemistry, Physics)

[6-5 in GCSE Combined Science will be sufficient to study any individual Science A Level]

• Students can re-sit either GCSE Mathematics or English Language.


<sup>#</sup>add up <u>all the grades you're on track for / predicted & divide by the number of subjects you're taking;</u> Magdalen students – if you're on-track for:

- a high grade count as an 8
- a strong grade count as a 5 or 6 (you decide!)
- a secure grade count as a 4
- a pass grade count as a 3
